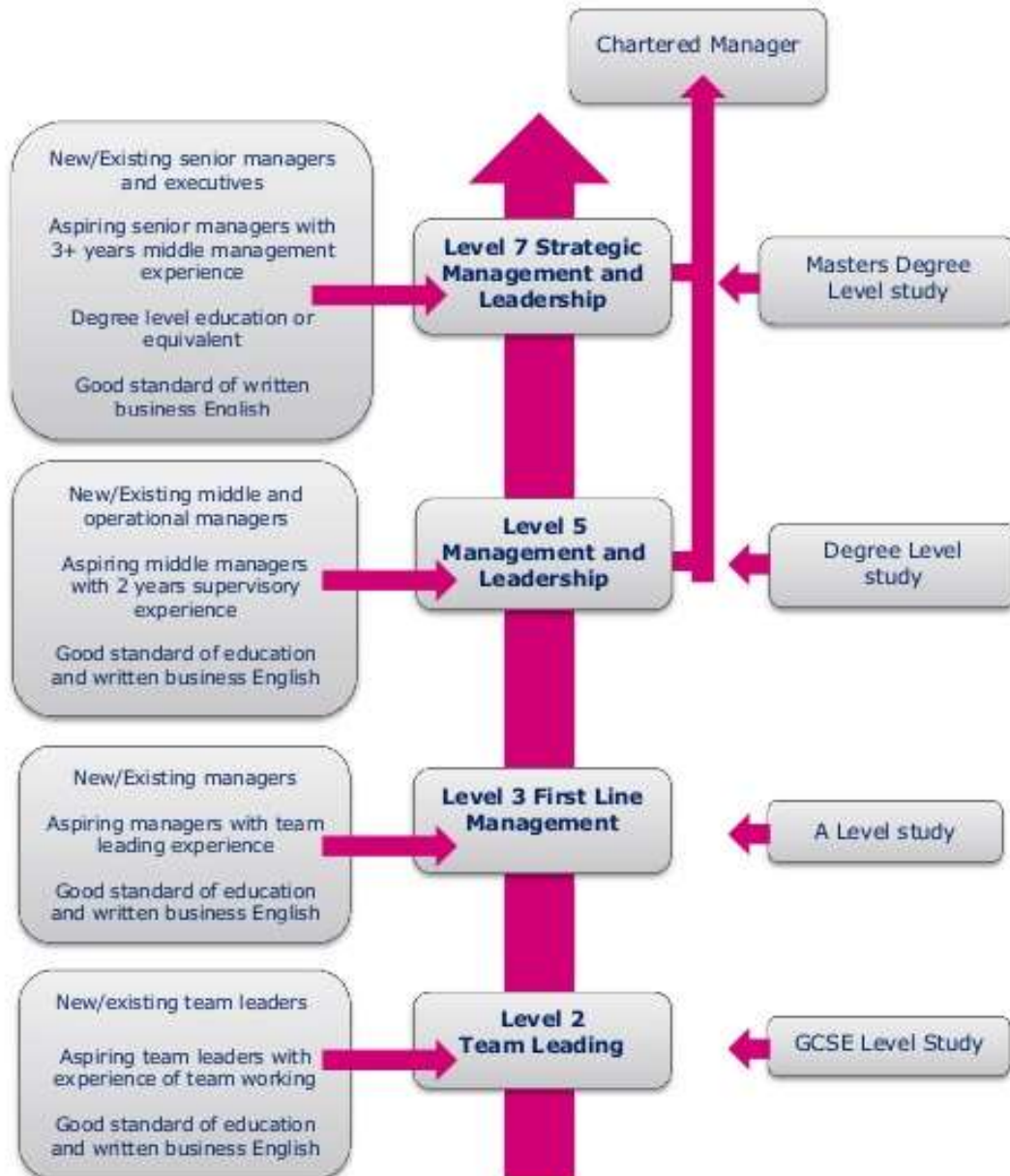


Management qualification choices

Deciding which qualification is best is a two-step process. Step 1 - match your current experience and levels of study ability to the qualification. Step 2 - decide on the size of qualification you want to study.

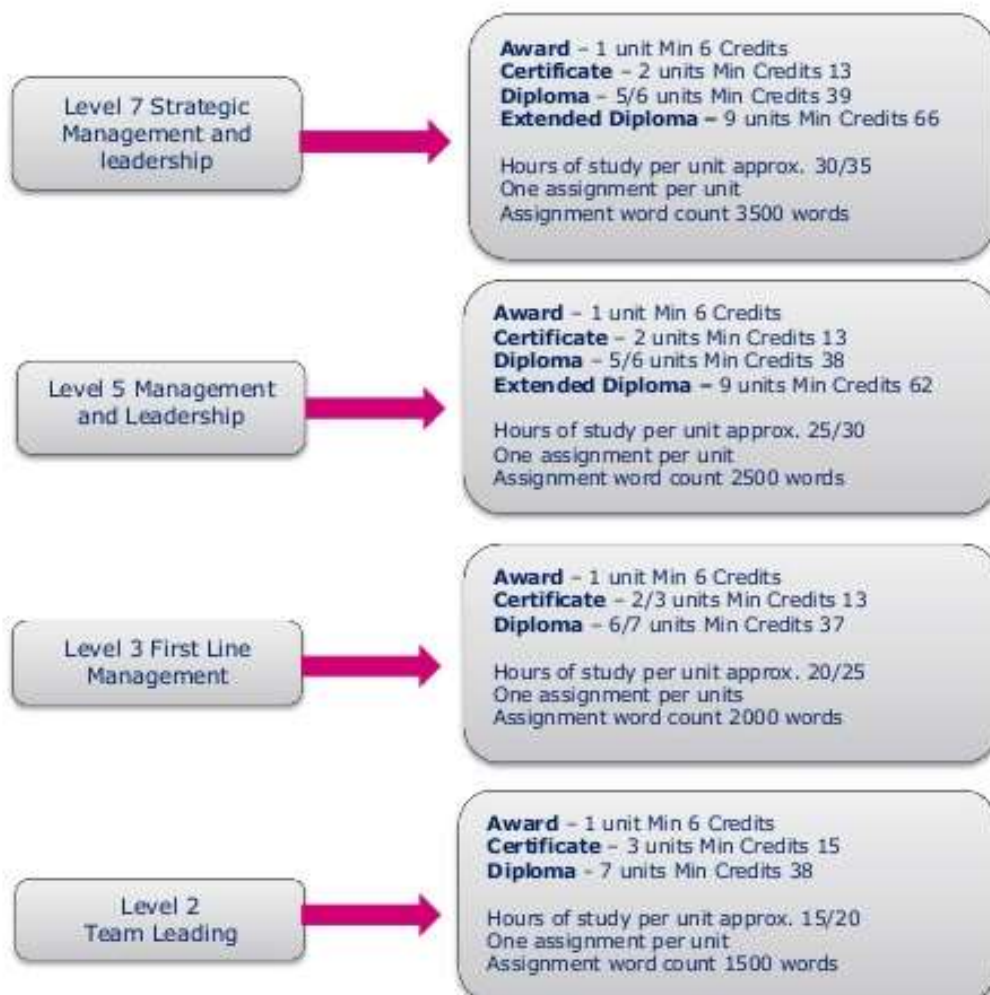
Step 1 Decide the Level

Use the Diagram below to help with this. The back of this guide has a self-assessment to help you map your existing management experience to the right management level.



Step 2 Decide the size

At each level there are a number of qualifications available which differ in the number of units you study. This impacts the amount of assignment you will do and the overall length of your course. Each unit covers a different topic and has its own assignment. The diagram below shows the different options available for each level.



At every level there is a set of units specially designed for that specific level of management.

Each unit studied covers a specific management topic and has a credit value. There is a minimum credit value to be achieved for each qualification.

For most qualifications there is a free choice of units from the available list as long as the total credit value meets the minimum requirements. This means you can build your qualification to suit your role.

The only exceptions to this are the Extended Diplomas at level 5 and 7, and the Level 2 and 3 Diplomas where there is a mix of mandatory and optional units.
